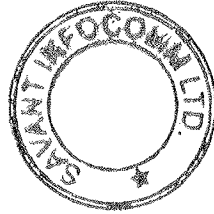

**US double-speak exposed *Ukraine's future unsure*

NATO Summit focus on war & not peace

'Europe rearming, America reaping rewards'

The just-concluded "NATO Summit" that took place in Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania (part of the Soviet Union until the early 1990s), does not bode well for global peace for the simple reason that none of the participants bothered to talk about peace and instead focussed on war! The agenda of the summit included "NATO expansion" and the "Ukraine-Russia War". US President Joe Biden has repeatedly emphasised that Ukraine's NATO membership is not possible as long as the war continues. Meanwhile, the US is pursuing a strategy that prolongs the war as much as possible.

Commentators noting that the US is waging a "proxy war" in Ukraine formulate this strategy as "continue the war until the last Ukrainian soldier stands". This strategy, of course, means more opportunities for the "American Military-Industrial Complex" that wants to have more butter (and maybe jam too) on its bread.

US foreign policy expert Chris Hedges articulated US' intentions in his article titled "They Lied About Afghanistan. They Lied About Iraq. Now

They Are Lying About Ukraine", which was published in *Salon* magazine recently.

Hedges draws attention to war profiteers, stating that most of the funds allocated for security assistance to Ukraine are invested in American defence production. According to Hedges, even if Russia does not want to be an enemy, it will be forced to become one.

He feels that the current NATO ensures American influence in Europe at a low cost, weakens Europe's ability to ensure its own security and prevents the emergence of a semi-autonomous European power.

Before Russia's "military operation" against Ukraine, approximately half of the military expenditure in Europe went to American producers and experts point out that this purchasing pattern has further increased.

They summarised the situation as follows: "Europe may be rearming, but America is reaping the rewards".

The Kyiv regime failed to meet the main requirement for the summit to be successful, which is to get security



guarantees and a "road map" for admission to NATO.

Now one wonders if US President Joe Biden and German Chancellor Olaf Scholz will openly explain reasons as to why they did not want Ukraine in the NATO road map? The Summit was attended by the Heads of States and Governments of all 30 NATO member countries.

The summit leaders agreed to strengthen NATO's deterrence and defense posture, increase defense spending, and provide more military assistance to Ukraine.

They also agreed to work more closely with partners in the Indo-Pacific region to counter the challenges posed by China.

NATO leaders agreed to increase defence spending. The alliance's target is for all members to spend at least two per cent of their GDP on defence.

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said at the meeting that the bloc's member states had taken three steps towards Ukraine, making a decision not to demand Ukraine implement its NATO Membership Action Plan, adopting

a multi-year programme of military assistance to Kyiv and approving the establishment of a NATO-Ukraine Council.

However, the final statement read out by Stoltenberg said that Ukraine would receive an invitation to join NATO once allies reached a consensus and all the conditions were met.

Ukrainian President Vladimir Zelensky at a press conference expressed dissatisfaction with the decision, saying that the Summit's outcome was not ideal for Kyiv as it had failed to get an

invitation to join NATO. NATO and Russia have been at odds for many years, and the situation has only worsened as the recent Summit focussed more on war and the leaders assembled did not make any effort to ensure peace prevails in the near future.

Tensions between NATO and Russia are a major source of instability in Europe. The two sides have been engaged in a war of words, and there is a real risk of military conflict heightening to a nuke war too. The nuke

makes its presence these days in Ukraine conflict talks and debates more often because NATO has a much larger military, but Russia has a more powerful nuclear arsenal.

The best way to avoid a war between NATO and Russia is through diplomacy. The two sides need to find a way to resolve their differences peacefully. This will not be easy but it is the only way to ensure peace and stability in Europe.

Western nations under the influence of the US seem to be engrossed in the anti-Russia stand as it can be deduced from the outcome of the recent Summit. The rest of the world is now worried that this unnecessary hatred will forever prevent the development of any normal and friendly relations.

And this in all likelihood will push for a new global order!

NATO, EU and their allies account for the lion's share of the global weapons sales with the United States being the unquestionable leader. Non-western countries together (including Russia and China) sell five times less weapons globally.

The global weapons sales figures have been arrived at using SIPRI TIV, which

measures transfers of military capability rather than the financial value of arms transfers.

A defence contractor General Atomics assured to send Kyiv two of its top-of-the-line MQ-9 Reaper drones, which are usually valued at about \$ 30 million per plane. Budget-conscious readers should keep in mind that shipping and handling – worth nearly \$ 20 million – has to be added to the actual cost of any arms deal.

Such data and global arms traders are stark reminders that, for arms makers, high-profile conflicts are a remarkable marketing opportunity. Ukraine president Zelenskiy did score wins elsewhere. French President Emmanuel Macron said Paris would start supplying long-range cruise missiles, following a similar announcement by Britain. Germany announced new aid worth 700 million Euros, including two Patriot air defence missile launchers and more tanks as well as fighting vehicles.

These will allow Ukrainian forces to hit Russian troops and supplies deep, beyond the front lines.

UN initiates debate on pros & cons of AI

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said that artificial intelligence (AI) has enormous potential for "good and evil" at scale and urged the international community to approach this technology with a sense of urgency, a global lens, and a learner's mindset.

The UN Security Council held a formal meeting on the global implications of AI for the first time chaired by UK Foreign Secretary James Cleverly, whose country is the president of the 15-member Council for the month of July.

There are concerns and calls for slowing the pace of new developments in artificial intelligence that has rapidly expanded in recent months as companies like OpenAI, Google and Microsoft continue to build systems.

Several notables in the field, including Elon Musk, demanded a pause on rapid developments citing "profound risks to society".

Speaking at the Council, Guterres said that AI could contribute between \$10 and \$15 trillion to the global economy by 2030 citing finance industry estimates.

But, he also warned that AI could cause "horrific levels of deaths and destruction" and could "enable new levels of authoritarian surveillance".

"Its creators themselves have warned that much bigger, potentially catastrophic and existential risks lie ahead," Guterres said. "Without action to address these risks, we are derelict in our



responsibilities to present and future generations".

Briefing the council, the co-founder of AI company Anthropic, Jack Clark said that the development of artificial intelligence cannot solely be left to private sector actors.

"The governments of the world must come together, develop state

capacity and make further development of powerful AI systems, a shared endeavor across all parts of society, rather than one dictated solely by a small number of firms competing with one another in the marketplace," Clark said.

British Foreign Secretary James Cleverly called

for global governance of artificial intelligence. "We must seize these opportunities and grasp the challenges of AI – including those for international peace and security – decisively, optimistically and from a position of global unity on essential principles," he added.

BRICS to discuss new members admission



The leaders of the BRICS countries will discuss at the Summit in South Africa the admission criteria for new participants, taking into account the numerous requests to join the organization,

Brazilian Foreign Minister Mauro Vieira told Sputnik.

"The number of countries interested in joining BRICS testifies to its importance on the world stage. Now we need to discuss and

agree on the criteria for evaluating these applications, which will be done at the summit of the presidents [in South Africa in August]," Vieira said.

Brazil, in particular, supports the application of its strategic partner - Argentina, the minister added.

"But first, as I have already said, we need to develop a roadmap for the future of the group and reach a consensus on the criteria, taking into account the numerous requests we receive," the minister concluded.

UN officials flay UK Illegal Immigration Bill

The Illegal Migration Bill passed by the Parliament in the United Kingdom (UK) is at odds with the country's obligations and will have profound consequences for people in need of international protection, the United Nations (UN) warned on Tuesday.

The UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Turk and UN High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi said in a joint statement that the legislation will exacerbate the already vulnerable situation of people who arrive irregularly in the UK. It will drastically limit their human rights, and put them at risk of detention and destitution, the UN officials said.

"As a result, their rights to health, an adequate standard of living, and to work are at risk, exposing them to the risk of exploitation and abuse," they added.

The new Bill removes access to asylum in the UK for anyone who arrives irregularly, having passed through a country - however briefly - where they did not face persecution.

It also bars them from presenting refugee protection or other human rights claims, no matter how compelling their circumstances.

In addition, it requires their removal to another country, with no guarantee that they will be able to access protection there.

"This new legislation significantly erodes the legal framework that has protected so many, exposing refugees to

grave risks in breach of international law," Grandi said. Meanwhile, "carrying out removals under these circumstances is contrary to prohibitions of refoulement and collective expulsions, rights to due process, to family and private life, and the principle of best interests of children concerned," High Commissioner Turk said.

The joint statement stressed that most people fleeing war and persecution either do not have, or are unable to access formal documents such as passports and visas. Safe and "legal" routes are rarely available to them, and the 1951 Refugee Convention explicitly recognizes that refugees may be compelled to enter a country of asylum irregularly.

"In addition to raising very serious legal concerns from the international perspective, this Bill sets a worrying precedent for dismantling asylum-related obligations that other countries,

including in Europe, international refugee and human rights protection system as a whole," Turk warned.
