Prestige at stake

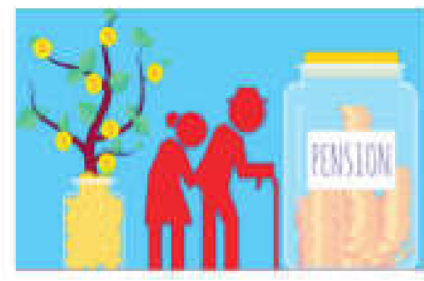

Social justice dept mulls hike in social security pension

There is some good news for beneficiaries of social security pension as the social justice department is working on a proposal to increase their pension. If it gets the nod of finance department then the pension will be more than double. Sources in the Social Justice Department said that currently, beneficiaries of social security pension get Rs 600 per month. To provide further financial assistance to them, the department is mulling to increase



pension to Rs 1500 per month. There are around 55.5 lakh beneficiaries of social security pension in the state. An officer of social justice department said that social security pension covers old people, Kalyani women (widow) and destitute people. They are getting Rs 600 per month as social security pen-

sion. Centre gives Rs 300 and remaining Rs 300 is shared by the state government.

Notably, few politicians have been raising their voice that the sum given under social security pension is very less and should be increased. Former minister and sitting MLA Gopal Bhargava was vocal in this regard. He had sometimes back stated that Laddi Behna s used to get Rs 1250 per month. On the contrary, people who are too aged gets mere Rs 600. He had pointed out towards this disparity. Luckily, his voice seems to have been heard.

Social Justice Department Minister Narayan Singh Kushwah told Free Press that the matter related to increase in social security pension is pending with the finance department. Two options have been given, first to increase to Rs 1k and the second is to increase it to Rs 1500.

A senior officer of social justice department said that

permissions are needed at different level. Once permission is received from the finance department, the proposal will be sent to the cabinet for clearance. However the process will take substantial time. The finance department will assess the proposal and after assessing its financial health, it will take further decision on it.

False claim: Girl's abduction story takes a twist

This led to her changing statements and coining new stories to maintain her claim of abduction. Betma Police Station in-charge Sanjay Singh Hindolia stated that the entire episode seemed suspicious right from the beginning.

26TH NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF PAEDIATRIC INFECTIOUS DISEASES-2024

Specialists urge parents to avoid traditional baby care methods

Experts at the 26th National Conference of Paediatric Infectious Diseases-2024 revealed that 70 per cent of newborns requiring medical care suffer from infections, often linked to harmful traditional practices.

Actions like withholding a mother's first milk, giving honey, or applying oil in a newborn's nose and ears were highlighted as infection risks. Specialists urged families to avoid these customs to protect infant health.

The conference brought together paediatric experts nationwide, focusing on child disease prevention and vaccination. Organised by the Childhood Infectious Disease Specialist Association with the Paediatric Infectious Diseases Academy, the event featured over 15 sessions on infection management, research

presentations, and discussions on rising paediatric specialisations.

Dr JS Tuteja, conference chairman, noted that awareness among parents is increasing, with more seeking timely care.

Dr Chetan Trivedi, secretary of the Paediatric Infectious Diseases Academy, added that viral infections, such as dengue, influenza, and COVID-19, are most prevalent, with bacterial infections like typhoid also posing risks. Vaccines, he emphasised, are crucial in reducing the spread of these infections.

The conference also highlighted antibiotic misuse as a critical concern. Dr Bhaskar Shenoy warned that excessive use threatens future effectiveness, urging careful use.

Experts recommended parents ensure hygiene, mask around infants if unwell, and avoid taking newborns to crowded areas to minimise infection risks.
