UP by elections: Wolves or jackals?



The UP by-elections are heating up and becoming increasingly interesting. The Samajwadi Party and Congress are gearing up for the by-polls to 10 assembly seats in Uttar Pradesh, with their INDIA bloc partners targeting the state government over its undemocratic working style, collapse of law and order, and a recent surge in wolf attacks. Leaders of both parties have confirmed that they will contest the by-polls unitedly.

In addition to the usual focus on the law-and-order situation and governance issues, the opposition has raised a significant concern regarding the wolf attacks in the state. Samajwadi Party chief spokesperson Rajendra Chaudhary remarked, "The government has failed on this front (stopping wolf attacks). It has left the entire state feeling insecure." Echoing his sentiments, Ajay Rai, the Congress State unit chief, stated that the government had failed to control

the wolf attack situation and that this "terror" was spreading towards urban areas.

On the other hand, the BJP claims that the state government is doing everything it can to address the wolf problem. In the past two months, eight people, including seven children, and about three dozen others were injured in alleged wolf attacks in Bahraich district. While four wolves have been captured, the attacks continue, with experts suggesting that the real "man-eaters" have yet to be caught.

Additionally, on Saturday, two children and five men were injured in suspected jackal attacks in two villages in the Jehanabad area of Pilibhit district.

In response to criticism from the Congress and Samajwadi Party, BJP spokesperson Aalok Verma stated, "Be it the wolves of the jungles or the wolves of society, dangerous animals cannot be allowed to roam freely." Verma further alleged, "Both the Samajwadi Party and the Congress support the wolves of society (criminals). The Samajwadi Party supports them directly, while Congress supports them indirectly." Nevertheless, it is a strategic move by the opposition to highlight the issue of wolf and jackal attacks in the state.

I believe that the opposition in Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Maharashtra should similarly address the growing menace of stray

dogs and cattle, which has become a significant issue. In Tamil Nadu, for instance, stray dogs and cattle have become a public nuisance, especially in urban areas. In 2023, the state recorded nearly 30,000 dog bite incidents. Surprisingly, Tamil Nadu is the only State where stray dogs and cattle roam freely even on beaches, threatening visitors and beach walkers. This is an issue that opposition parties must take up seriously.

As for UP, the BJP holds 251 seats in the 403-member assembly, while the opposition Samajwadi Party has 105 seats. BJP allies, Apna Dal (Sonelal) and the NISHAD party, have 13 and 5 seats, respectively. The upcoming by-elections are crucial for the BJP, as they will provide insights into public perception of the ruling party. The results could serve as a valuable feedback for the BJP to adjust its strategy ahead of the assembly elections scheduled for March 2027.
