# Anganwadi centers being upgraded for special backward tribes

STAFF REPORTER ■ BHOPAL

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has said that continuous efforts are being made to upgrade the arrangements of Anganwadi centers to improve the nutritional level of women and children. Sahariya, Baiga and Bhariya special backward tribes reside in the state. The Central government has considered the design of buildings of Anganwadi centers as the best for these areas. As per the parameters of the Central Government in Madhya Pradesh, under PM-Janman, one Anganwadi center will be opened for every 100 special backward tribe population. This year, the Central Government has approved the construction of 355 new Anganwadi center buildings for Madhya Pradesh in this cur-

rent year whereas last year the Center had approved 194 new Anganwadi centres. Chief Minister Yadav has issued instructions to departmental officers to make Anganwadi centres more useful and efficient. While seeking information about the operation of Anganwadi centres, he has also given instructions to make innovations with public cooperation. He has said that Anganwadi centers not only play an important role in the nutrition and primary education of children but are also important for the empowerment of women and the well-being of families. The facilities of Anganwadi centers are being improved in the state. With this, children can get a clean and safe environment. A total of 97 thousand 329

Anganwadi centers are operating in Madhya Pradesh. There are 12 thousand 670 mini Anganwadi centers among them. Out of these, electricity facility has been provided in 79 thousand 910 buildings. The work of providing electricity in 8 thousand 692 buildings in the state is in progress. This facility will also be made available in the remaining 8 thousand 727 centers in the coming financial year. Approval has been given for the construction of 1782 new Anganwadi buildings with an amount of Rs 199.94 crore in the financial year 2024-25. Nutrition gardens are being established in the centers where there are boundary walls. Nutrition gardens (Poshan Vatikas) have been established in 21 thousand 534 centers in the state. As many as 51 thousand 63

Anganwadi centers are running in departmental buildings in the state. The number of Anganwadi centers operating in other government buildings is 20 thousand 727 and the number of Anganwadi centers operating in rented buildings is 25 thousand 539. In the year 2024, 194 new Anganwadi centers have been opened in the state under the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Nyay Maha Abhiyan (PM-Janman). Getting full support from Central government It may be noted that the Central Government has set the population criteria for the new Anganwadi centre. According to this, there is a provision to open 01 Anganwadi center for a population of 300 to 800 in the tribal area/project. In the rural and urban project, there is a provision to open 01 Anganwadi center for the pop-

ulation of 400 to 800 and there- after 01 Anganwadi center for every multiple of 800. Similarly, under PM Janman, a total of 549 new Anganwadi centers and 572 buildings have been approved by the Government of India. Under PM-Janman, 100 percent financial assistance is provided for building construction. A provision of Rs 68.64 crore at the rate of Rs 12 lakh per building has been made for Madhya Pradesh. Saksham Anganwadi Center The work of strengthening Anganwadi centers is going on continuously. Along with electricity, other facilities are also being provided in the centers with public cooperation. In the last two financial years in the state, a total of 11 thousand 706 Anganwadi centers have got the benefit of upgradation as capable Anganwadi centres.

## Junior Auditor in Lokayukta net

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Lokayukta Police on Wednesday carried out a raid at six premises of a junior auditor posted in the Technical Education Department. Junior Auditor Ramesh Hingorani, a resident of Bairagarh, has been booked under the charge of disproportionate assets. Sources told that the action was part of the ongoing investigation over alleged financial irregularities in the department. The investigation so far, revealed his assets worth Rs 90 crore. The development came after registering a case of alleged possession of assets disproportionate to the junior auditor's known sources of income. At least six teams of special police establishment (SPE) of

Lokayukta carried out the raids at multiple locations in Bhopal. DSP Lokayukta told the press that Ramesh Hingorani has been booked for the possession of disproportionate assets. "Six teams of Lokayukta carried out searches at multiple locations in Bhopal and Bairagarh," he added. He informed that four luxury cars and other properties have been seized from locations. "We are yet to evaluate the total assets recovered from different places," Shukla added. The Lokayukta have found that Ramesh Hingorani has invested in the real estate business in Bhopal and other places in the state. His family has been accused of selling government land to other real estate developers.

He said that apart from regular talk-and-chalk sessions, students will also be apprised of the work culture in government offices and departments through tours to administrative offices. Registrations for the classes will remain open at the college premises from 8 AM to 10 AM between October 18-25. Coordinators will remain on campus until 10 AM on each of these days.

## Portal Hypertension treated with Interventional Radiology TIPS procedure

Bhopal Memorial Hospital and Research Centre (BMHRC) has successfully performed a life-saving interventional radiology TIPS (Transjugular Intrahepatic Portosystemic Shunt) procedure on a 43-year-old patient suffering from portal hypertension due to liver cirrhosis. This innovative treatment was provided free of cost, while similar procedures in private hospitals typically range from Rs 4-5 lakhs. The patient, who had been facing recurrent hematemesis (vomiting blood) and significant ascitic fluid accumulation, was treated by a dedicated team including Dr. Radheshyam Meena, Associate Professor, Department of Radiology, BMHRC; Dr. Aman Kumar, Associate Professor, Department of Radiology, AIIMS Bhopal; Dr. Tripti Mishra, Visiting



Consultant, Gastroenterology Department, BMHRC; and Dr. Kanika Suhag, Associate Professor, Anaesthesiology Department, BMHRC. Liver cirrhosis is a serious condition characterized by the gradual replacement of healthy liver tissue with scar tissue, which can arise from various causes, including excessive alcohol consumption, viral infections such as hepatitis B and C, exposure to toxins, obesity, and other metabolic disorders. Over time, these factors impair liver function, leading to severe complications like portal hypertension, where increased pressure in the portal vein causes symptoms such as vomiting blood and fluid accumulation in the abdomen. The TIPS procedure involved implanting a stent between the portal vein and the hepatic vein to improve blood flow and relieve these symptoms. Why is blood flow from the liver important? The portal vein is a major vein that car-

ries blood from the intestines, stomach, spleen, and pancreas directly to the liver. This blood contains nutrients and toxins that enter the body during the digestion process. The liver cleans this blood, removes toxins, and produces essential proteins and other substances. This clean blood then leaves the liver through the hepatic vein, goes directly to the heart, and circulates to other parts of the body. Dr. Manisha Shrivastava, Director In-Charge of BMHRC, highlighted the importance of advanced interventional procedures: "Complex procedures such as interventional radiology offer patients lower risk, less pain, and faster recovery. At BMHRC, we are committed to providing such advanced treatments, exemplifying the successful collaboration between our experts and those from AIIMS Bhopal."

## Sanchi dairy to DRM intersection road still closed

Barricaded for nearly eight months, a busy road on Sanchi Dugdh Sangh to DRM intersection continues to remain closed for traffic despite a Metro authority notification which had earlier said that the road will be opened for traffic on October 15. The continuing closure adds to the woes of nearly five lakh commuters who have to bear traffic snarls and travel an extra seven kilometers due to the diversion. The thoroughfare, which was to be opened on Tuesday, is now likely remain closed for traffic till at least the first week of November. Earlier, Metro authorities had notified the opening of the road on October 15, but the schedule was later retracted due to ongoing civil work. One of the main arterial road circuits in the state capital, the road has remained barricaded since March this year, causing immense inconvenience

to lakhs of commuters who are forced to take alternate routes. The Metro notification has only added to commuter woes as citizens were guided to long detours after the Metro management failed to communicate a change in plans to citizens. Area residents say that some 2.5 lakh vehicles pass through the area which has long remained a bone of contention between railway authorities and PWD on one hand and Metro authorities on the other. The three departments often point in the direction of the others when faced with tough questions regarding the opening of the road. The barricading, now in its seventh month, has been forcing the commuters from Narmadapuram Road to the ISBT and Chetak Bridge to take detours via Alkapuri, Ekaturpur, and DRM Road. The closure of the road has resulted in losses or local businesses and those delivering essential services to the area.

## Safety and infrastructure review meet held

Jabalpur: Top railway officials from the region attended a coordination review meeting under the chairmanship of General Manager, West Central Railway, Shobhana Bandyopadhyaya. The meeting covered several important topics, including safety, key performance index (KPI) metrics, capital expenditure (CapEx), infrastructure development, and the safety inspection of railway lines and trains. Discussions were also held to ensure the availability of safety equipment and amenities for railway personnel during maintenance, as well as emphasizing the importance of safe train operations. Initiating proceedings, Bandyopadhyaya underlined that safe and secure operations remain a top priority and directed officials to conduct regular reviews and inspections of infrastructure work on new railway lines and yards, as well as along sensitive rail sections.

She also instructed regular patrolling by gatekeepers and compliance with safety-related rules, particularly ensuring the supply of safety equipment and amenities for assistant station masters and other railway staff. Stressing the need for compliance with directives set by the Railway Board regarding safety and security, Bandyopadhyaya sought special focus on the implementation of planned improvements related to railway track safety. The general manager provided necessary guidelines to maximize capital expenditure (CapEx) and mitigate signal failures across all three divisions. Furthermore, she directed the Divisional Railway Managers to ensure nighttime inspections of rail sections from a safety perspective. She also highlighted the need for cleanliness forums and reviewed the progress of infrastructure work and initiatives aimed at increasing railway revenue.

## BMC Commissioner inspects building

Bhopal: Municipal Commissioner Harendra Narayan inspected the under-construction headquarters building of the civic body on Wednesday and called for the project. He underlined the need to step up the pace of work on the auditorium decoration, front elevation, cafeteria, and STP construction, and other work. He said that adequate arrangements should be made for including a bank and ATM in the premises. During the inspection, the civic body chief also reviewed the designs for furniture, and issued directives for the immediate commencement of woodwork from the top

floor of the building. Additional Commissioner Nidhi Singh, Chief Engineer Santosh Gupta, and other corporation officials were part of the visit along with representatives from the consultancy and construction agencies. The Commissioner also directed officials to ensure that all remaining work at the headquarter building. Work for the new municipal headquarters is underway, after several decades that the civic body spent at its makeshift offices at the historical Sadar Manzil in the heart of the old city.

## MP set to become the mining capital of India

Madhya Pradesh, rich in natural resources, supported by favorable policies and robust infrastructure, offers vast potential for investment and growth in the mining sector, a vital contributor to India's mineral wealth. As the nation's sole diamond-producing state and a leading source of various other minerals, Madhya Pradesh ranks first in manganese, copper, and ore production, second in rock phosphate, third in limestone, and fourth in coal. These achievements underscore the state's pivotal role in the mineral industry and its contribution to energy security. A two-day conclave will be held on October 17 at the International Kushabhau Thackeray Convention Center in

Bhopal. This conclave will focus on the perspectives of industrialists and academicians. Technical sessions will also be held on advances in digitalization and mining technology, particularly Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML). The participants will also get an opportunity to gain insight into upcoming technologies by mining start-ups. Various sessions of the conclave include Coal and Energy, Advances in Exploration, Limestone and Cement, Mineral Opportunities, Mineral Development, and Energy and Hydro-Carbon, which will highlight new energy possibilities. The second day of the conclave, on 18th October, will see a round table meeting focused on mineral-based industries, coal, energy, and hydro-carbon, which will provide a

platform for collaboration and discussion among the stakeholders. The country's only diamond deposit is in Panna district of Madhya Pradesh. Operation of the Majhgana diamond mine here has also started. The diamond mine produces one lakh carats of diamonds every year. Also, Bundar Diamond Block has reserves of 32.2 million carats of diamonds. Malazkhand Copper Mine in the state is India's largest copper mine. 5 to 10 thousand tonnes of copper is extracted from here every day. 70 percent of India's total copper reserves are in Madhya Pradesh. Similarly, the Sasan coal mine located in the state is also famous for huge mining equipment. A moving dragline is used here, with a bucket of 61 cubic meters, which is the largest so far in India.
