Editorial

Let us respect & nurture women

India is a source, destination and transit country for women being trafficked for the use of forced labor and commercial sexual exploitation. Women are being held in debt bondage and are very vulnerable to forced labor working in rice mills, brick kilns, and agriculture and in embroidery factories. Interestingly, a television debate concluded that divorce rates and women empowerment are directly proportional. Empowered though, women's status has not been any better, thanks to honour killings, call-centre atrocities, female infanticides and you name it. Imagine a world without it. The world of work is changing, and with significant implications for

women. On one hand, we have globalization, technological and digital revolution and the opportunities they bring, and on the other hand, the growing informality of labour, unstable livelihoods and incomes, new fiscal and trade policies and environmental impacts-all of which must be addressed in the context of women's economic empowerment. It has rightly pointed out that "Single means much more than living life your way". It is found that a single woman faces many psychological and emotional hurdles because of the traditional views of society. The class of single women with a new status may be the direct result of the new concept of women's development. One would find that facilities in our country to welcome this new trend are still inadequate and young women will have to be trained for such a possibility. There are many single women who are self-confident and have a positive self-image. Women prefer to stay single because it gives them the right to live the way they liked and utilize their income the way they wished. In India, a good

number of women have begun to remain single and they have valued their independence regarding physical matters and decision making. Our society needs to change, to help the single women to stand on their feet with dignity and pride. The phenomenon of being single either by choice or by circumstances, is a deviation from traditional expectations but both the family as well as the women themselves need to redefine their concept of suitability of a marriage partner. Inter-cast or inter-religious marriages could be encouraged as this would broaden the range of choice of partners. Society should stop exploiting them and respect their right to be happy and independent. Crimes rates against women are much higher in big cities than in either small cities or rural areas. Time has helplessly watched women suffering in the form of discrimination, oppression, exploitation, degradation, aggression, humiliation. In a country where women and girls are traditionally revered as the Mother and the Goddess, this is simply unacceptable. A society that is unable to respect, protect and

nurture its women and children loses its moral moorings and runs adrift. The major lacuna in the laws is that they are not gender neutral. Many women and their family members, therefore, misuse them to settle scores, intimidate and harass the husband and his family. It is not uncommon to project self-inflicted injuries as assault by husbands. Sensitivity training and knowledge of the rights of women and children are another vital need and must be made mandatory for all law enforcement agencies. To increase the reporting of such cases at first we need to empower the women and children. They must be educated on their rights and encourage them to come forward to register the cases. There are many violent cases but due to stigma in the society very few are reported. The problem cannot be solved by the government alone but by a national awakening involving the entire country and civil society. Axita Cotton rolls out Bonus Shares



Ahmedabad, Axita Cotton Limited, a leading producer of cotton bales and cotton seeds, has announced the issuance of Bonus Shares to its eligible Shareholders. reflects our confidence in the future growth potential. We are sharing our success with those who have supported us along the way." As of the current date, the Company's paid-up Equity Share Capital stands at ₹26.08 crore which comprises 26.08 crore Equity Shares with a face value of ₹1 each. Following the Bonus issue, this will increase to ₹34.77 crore, with 34.77 crore Equity Shares. The Company has allocated 78.69 crore from its free reserves to fund the Bonus issue which is expected to be completed within two months of the Board's approval. Reaching another significant milestone, Axita has announced the successful registration of the company's first carbon credit pilot project under the voluntary carbon market. US vice presidential debate: Democracy matters, as does decency

Those watching the 105-minute United States vice presidential debate between Minnesota Governor and Democrat Tim Walz and Republican Senator from Ohio, JD Vance, early Tuesday morning would have been struck by how different it was from the presidential debate. The latter, which took place on the eve of the thirteenth anniversary of 9/11 was a bare-knuckles, no-holds-barred, nasty and aggressive exchange. The VP face-off, in contrast, was held on the eve of the 155th Gandhi Jayanti, the birthday of India's apostle of peace. It was, thankfully, much more pleasant and civilized. In fact, it was a model

of reasonable and respectful political exchange. My take-away, as an Indian? I'll pick up a phrase that was bandied about by both candidates towards the end of the debate: "democracy matters". This is absolutely true. Not only for the US, but also for the world. But what was equally important, at least for me, is that decency matters too. Decency, affability, debate, dissent, agreeing to disagree, across the political divide. The realization that the fight between Republicans and Democrats is not a zero-sum game. Neither is it a "winner takes all" battle. This is a big

lesson for us in India too. The ruling party and the opposition must, in functional democracies, work together for the greater common good. Their cooperation can be issue based, rather than ideological. But cooperation there must be. Who won the debate? Let's start by acknowledging that both did well. The spin room afterwards in various channels are not reliable, because they are notoriously partisan. Walsh started a bit nervous but emerged stronger in the end. He came across as a likeable person and good governor of the state of Minnesota. His knowledge, from first-hand experience in running an

important stance, was convincing whenever needed. He also addressed viewers directly, assuring them that the country would be safe if the Kamala Harris-Tim Walz ticket wins the elections just thirty-five days away. Vance was smooth, suave, polished, and quite friendly, agreeing with Walz, nodding now and then, offering the latter his support if the Harris-Walz team won, but also attacking Harris wherever possible. Especially on illegal immigration, weak leadership, wrong economic policies, and censorship. But Vance didn't have clear answers on gun control, housing, child care, and other contentious issues. Interestingly, on foreign policy,

both agreed that Iran is the villain and that Israel would be supported by the US. At the end of the debate, the two Veeps came across as acceptable running mates, both from the Midwest, both solid, hard-working, middle class, white Americans. What this means is that Vance managed to make the Republican ticket more likeable and less threatening. He normalized and stabilized Trump. He repeated Trump's name many times, trying to make him look reliable rather than unpredictable, likeable rather than nasty. Walz, on the other hand, hardly referred to Harris by name. He kept calling her Vice-President, which was confusing.
