Ominous warnings from Russia over Biden's signal

Kremlin warns that using long-range missiles will raise the stakes

KYIV

PRESIDENT Joe Biden's decision to let Ukraine strike targets inside Russia with US-supplied long-range missiles was met with ominous warnings from Moscow, a hint of menace from Kyiv and nods of approval from some Western allies.

Biden's shift in policy added an uncertain and potentially crucial new factor to the war on the eve of its 1,000-day milestone. News of Biden's change came on the day a Russian ballistic missile with cluster munitions struck a residential area of Sumy, a city in northern Ukraine, killing 11 people, including two children, and injuring 84 others.

On Monday, another Russian missile attack started fires in two apartment blocks in Odessa, in southern Ukraine. At least eight people were killed and many more were injured. Ukrainian lawmaker Oleksii Honcharenko said in a video he posted on Telegram from the site of the attack.

Washington is easing limits on what Ukraine can strike with US-made weaponry, US officials said, after months of ruling out such a move over fears of escalating the conflict and bringing about a direct confrontation between Russia and NATO.

The scope of the new firing guidelines isn't clear. But the change came after the US, South Korea and NATO said recently that North Korean troops are in Russia and apparently are being deployed to help the Russian army drive Ukrainian troops out of Russia's Kursk border region.

Ukraine's outnumbered army backward in the eastern Donetsk region. It has also conducted a devastating and deadly aerial campaign against civilian areas in Ukraine.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov on Monday referred journalists to a statement made by Russian President Vladimir Putin in September, in which he said allowing Ukraine to target Russia would significantly raise the stakes in the conflict.

It would change 'the very nature of the conflict dramatically,' Putin said at the time. This will mean that NATO countries – the United States and European countries – are at war with Russia.'

Peskov claimed that Western countries supplying long-range weapons also provide targeting services to Kyiv. "This fundamentally changes the modality of their involvement in the con-

flict," Peskov said.

Last June, Putin warned that Russia could provide long-range weapons to others to strike Western targets in response to NATO allies allowing Ukraine to use their arms to attack Russian territory. He also reaffirmed Moscow's readiness to use nuclear weapons if it sees a threat to its sovereignty.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy gave a muted response to the approval that he and his government have been requesting of Biden for more than a year.

"Today, much is being said in the media about us receiving permission for the relevant actions," Zelenskyy said in his address on Sunday.

"But strikes are not made with words. Such things are not announced. The missiles will speak for themselves," Zelenskyy added. AP

Munambam Waqf row: IUML chief meets priests

KOCHI: The top leaders of the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML) met Latin Catholic priests on Monday and held discussions to resolve the ongoing Waqf land issue in the coastal hamlet of Munambam in Ernakulam district.

Several families have been fighting against the Waqf Board's claim on their properties in Munambam, located about 35 km from Kochi, with the support of the Latin Catholic Church. They allege that the Waqf Board's claim is legally invalid.

IUML state chief Panakkad Sadiq Ali Shihab Thangal and senior leader P K Kunhalikutty visited Verapoly Archbishop Joseph Kalathiparambil at the bishop's house.

Bishop Kalathiparambil and Thangal later told reporters that their meeting was very warm and positive. Everybody

who took part in the discussion wanted to resolve the issue as soon as possible through legal means, they said.

"Several good suggestions were made during the discussion. Our collective opinion is that there are legal and factual issues involved, and it is the government's responsibility to make effective interventions in the matter," Thangal said.

He also said those who took part in the meeting wanted the government to urgently convene a meeting of everyone involved in the issue and resolve it amicably.

The meeting of the IUML leaders and church came amidst growing resentment among a significant portion of the Christian population in the state regarding the LDF and UDF's stance on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024, introduced by the Centre. PTI

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, who had recently underscored the need for increasing population, has come up with bills to remove the restriction on those with two or more children from contesting in local body elections.

The Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly on Monday passed the bills to amend the AP Panchayat Raj and AP Municipal Acts. As per the amendments, individuals irrespective of the number of children they have, can contest the local body elections hereafter. In fact, it

was the Naidu government, which amended the Panchayat Raj and Municipal Administration Department Acts in 1994 to control the population by incorporating the 'Two children norm' to disqualify individuals with more than two children from contesting the local body elections.

Now, Naidu has shifted focus on population management, and came up with further amendments to the Acts to allow those having more children to contest the local body elections.

Accordingly, the State go-

vernment tabled the bills to amend the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act, 1994, the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965, and the Municipal Corporation Act, 1955 to relax the two children norm.

While reviewing the population policy three decades after implementation of the two children norm, the government found that as per the National Family Health Survey, the Total Fertility Rate (TFR) declined from 3.7 children in 1992-92 to 2.1 in 2019-21 in rural areas, and from 2.6 in 2001 to 1.5 in recent years in

urban areas.

"As the declining fertility rates, population stabilisation and changing socio-economic conditions proved to be outdated and counterproductive, the government felt that repealing sections intended to control the population, will promote inclusive governance, reflect contemporary social values and align with global best practices and demographic trends," the bills read.

The government came up with the bills to amend AP Panchayat Raj Act, 1994, AP Municipalities Act, 1965 and Municipal Corporation Act, 1955.

Farmer dies in jumbo attack in Erode's Kadambur hills

A 55-year-old farmer died after being attacked by a wild elephant at Kadambur hills in the district on Sunday night.

The deceased was identified as K Maran, a resident of Anaikarai village near Kuthiyalathur. Police said, "Maran was a farmer who owned five acres of land where he cultivated maize."

There is a reserve forest boundary 50 metres away from his land and he used to stay in the fields every night to protect crops from wild boars."

On Sunday night, around 10.40 pm, the 55-year-old went to the farm. Suddenly a wild elephant came out and attacked him, killing Maran on the spot. Hearing noises, people in nearby fields rushed there, but the elephant receded back to the forest, the police added.

On information, Kadambur forest range officials and police conducted an investigation at the spot.

Police recovered Maran's body and sent it to Sathyamangalam Government Hospital for post-mortem examination.

A case has been registered and further investigation is under way.

Many TN jobseekers lured into cyber slavery'

"A Golden Triangle persists near the borders of Cambodia, Laos and Myanmar where many fraudulent companies are operating," said M Rajkumar, the Protector of Emigrants (PoE) for Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.

Speaking at the workshop for journalists conducted at the Press Information Bureau in Coimbatore on Monday, Rajkumar said that a trend of cyber slavery is posing a risk to job seekers from Tamil Nadu and seems very professional.

"These operations lure job seekers through phone calls, and WhatsApp interviews. Once selected, employees in-

struct candidates to enter the country on tourist visas, leading them to approach illegal agents for assistance. Once caught in this trap, candidates find it difficult to return to India. Some are forced to work under these conditions, fearing the loss of their investments, and soon become cyber slaves

According to the PoE, the Indian Embassy has rescued over hundred people from cyber slavery in 2024 with the Tamil Nadu CB-CID police registering approximately 20 cases and arresting around 30 people in connection with these scams. "Additionally, we have identified around 300 illegal recruiting agencies and shared this information with the police," Rajkumar added. He further said that those seeking to go abroad for work have to verify the genuineness of their agents by checking if they are licensed through the Ministry of External Affairs website emigrate.gov.in. According to the website, there are 2,961 approved recruiting agents across India of which 273 are in Tamil Nadu.

TEMPLE police and forest officials sent the bodies to the Tiruchendur GH for postmortem. Sources said Udhayakumar's father was also a mahout. Police have registered a case and initiated an investigation. Speaking to TNIE, District Forest Officer (DFO) Revathi Raman said a six-member team, comprising veterinarians, has been deployed to monitor the health and behaviour of the elephant.

"The attack is a sudden provocation, and it is hard to ascertain the cause. The elephant will be observed for a certain period," he said. Previously, an elephant at the Tiruchendur temple had attacked its mahout in 1992, and another elephant, Shanthi, had attacked her mahout in 2001. In both incidents, the mahouts had escaped with injuries, temple sources said.

With cybercrime becoming a global issue, Shikha Goel, director of the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TCSB), says the importance of awareness can never be overstated. From introducing a curriculum to make kids aware of safe online habits and asking the elderly to practise cyber hygiene, Goel, in an interaction with *TNE*, reveals that the ever-evolving and 'most-organised' cybercrime scene makes it difficult for the cops to dismantle such networks. Additionally, the DGP of the Crime Investigation Department and Women Safety Wing shares that the efforts of the police to make the city safer for women and girls are her biggest motivators.

Over the past six months, Telangana police arrested 165 people involved in 795 cyber-crime cases locally and over 3,000 cases nationwide. Should cybercrime awareness be integrated into school syllabi? What steps are being taken to safeguard the elderly from cybercrimes?

Siddaramaiah criticised Union Minister HD Kumaraswamy and other BJP leaders, questioning their silence on Karnataka's rightful tax share. "Karnataka pays ₹4.5 lakh crore in taxes but gets only ₹59,000 crore in return," he said.

The government is reviewing legal options against Maharashtra's advertisements, asserting they were issued for electoral gain.
