# A tweet to Maneka saves woman from pavement

**Kolkata:** A tweet to women and child development minister Maneka Gandhi was all it took to find a mentally ill woman a shelter.

The woman had been living on a pavement in Serampore for almost two years. A banker from the locality had to tweet to Maneka after her attempts at running to NGOs and the administration failed.

"Seeing this woman for almost two years on streets of Serampore in Hooghly district, West Bengal without shelter. Please help," tweeted the young banker at 10.15am on May 16.

"Please send the details through direct message (DM)," the minister replied at noon. "Direct message sent though DM," the banker tweeted back at 1pm.

Maneka's office intervened swiftly, asking the district administration to rescue the woman. Police swung into action and rescued the destitute woman on May 17.

According to the banker,

she had earlier approached some local NGOs and police so that the woman could be moved to a shelter.

She spoke to the woman and traced her family to a nearby locality. The family reportedly told her the woman had psychological problems and would leave home on her own. But the woman, who is believed to be in her 30s, said she did not want to go back as she was often beaten up at home.

"I have been seeing her near an ATM at Burtoola for almost two years now. I did not want to give up and kept the issue alive discussing with like-minded friends," said the banker.

Subhadip Mukherjee, a teacher who had helped rescue

another woman from Salt Lake's Sector V in a similar way last July by tweeting to Maneka, suggested that she do the same.

"I am impressed by the response from the minister and happy that the woman has been rescued," the banker told TOI.

The woman is now at the Serampore women's police station. Police took her for a check-up and found she had psychological problems. "We have sought permission from the court to send her to a psychiatric hospital, where she can get proper treatment. Till then, she is being looked after by officers at the Serampore women's police station," said an officer.

# Hurriyat alarmed over NIA probe

**Srinagar:** The Hurriyat Conference reacted with anger and alarm to the Centre's announcement of National Investigation Agency's (NIA's) probe into the source of its foreign funding.

NIA stepped in after allegations made by Hurriyat official Nayeem Khan of the Geelani faction that separatists, including Syed Ali Geelani, received funds from Pakistan-based terrorist organisation, Lashkar-e-Taiba, to carry out terror activities.

Nayeem was stung earlier this week by reporters of India Today in which he had made these alleged disclosures. Hurriyat spokesman Avaz Akbar, of the Geelani faction, denied links to LeT, saying, "The agency has earlier harassed and questioned party officials, including Mohammad Ashraf Sehrai and Syed Geelani's son-in-law Altaf Ahmad Shah, but could not find anything. These are fabricated charges to pressure the Hurriyat, as authorities are unable to control clashes in Kashmir."

JKLF chairman Yasin Malik, who joined the Hurriyat in 2016, said: "They try to prove that I am receiving funds from Pakistan for organizing the unrest. They have tried to do the same several times but failed to prove that I am political corrupt man." Sources said: "After completing the preliminary investigations, NIA will question Geelani, Nayeem Khan, Gazi Javed Baba and Farooq Ahmed Dar alias Bitta

## Revelations will be probed: Jaitley

A TV sting on a senior Hurriyat leader was as good as a confession about separatists accepting funding from Pakistan, finance minister Arun Jaitley said on Friday. Exposed on Pakistan funding the separatist Hurriyat leaders has only brought into the open what was known for long in informed circles and the revelations will be investigated, Jaitley told the media here. Jaitley said: "This money has been used to organise violence, burn schools and conspire against the residents of Kashmir. The information now available will be investigated." TNN

The sting operation allegedly disclosed the nexus between Geelani and Jamat-ud-Dawa chief Hafiz Saeed. An intelligence officer said: "We are scrutinizing phone and bank details of several other people suspected to be involved in routing funds to separatists and militants."

## Malik claims intrusion, scribe claims lensman attack

**Srinagar:** Police on Friday registered a case against a television journalist after Kashmir separatist leader Yasin Malik said she entered his bedroom without permission.



The reporter claimed that Malik assaulted her camera man and damaged their mobile phones.

Malik claimed the journalist entered his house, saying she had an appointment with him. He alleged the journalist barged into his bedroom and started asking him questions about the NIA probe into the funding of separatist leaders.

"She had lied to my sister that she had an appointment with me. The fact is she never called for an appointment," he told reporters here after filing a complaint with police for "breach of privacy". Police have registered a case against the journalist and the cameraman under section 448 of the Ranbir Penal Code (illegal trespassing), which carries a punishment of up to one year in prison and a fine of Rs 1,000.

The journalist said Malik pushed the channel's cameraman down a flight of stairs. Malik denied that he had assaulted her. He said he took away her mobile phone because he feared she was using it as a recorder. The journalist claimed she and the cameraman had made a "legal and ethical entry" into his house. PTI

# NIA to go easy on Aseemanand bail

**New Delhi:** NIA will not challenge the bail granted to Swami Aseemanand in the 2007 Mecca Masjid blast case two months ago. Its decision is based on a couple of Supreme Court verdicts that had justified bail to "non-hardcore" terror under-trials on grounds of delayed prosecution and long incarceration.

Aseemanand had walked free in March after he was granted bail by a Hyderabad court in the 2007 blast case. At the time, he was already on bail in the 2007 Samjhauta Express blast case and had just got acquitted in the Ajmer Sharif blast case.

told TOI that NIA took a decision around 20 days back not to appeal against the Hyderabad court's bail order. NIA chief Sharad Kumar, when contacted, declined to confirm or deny the development. Earlier, the agency had refused to challenge bail granted to Aseemanand by Punjab and Haryana high court in the 2008 Samjhauta blast case, taking the view that there were no legal grounds to file an appeal in the Supreme Court.

Sources said NIA's decision not to challenge Aseemanand's bail in the Mecca Masjid blast case is based on Supreme Court verdicts in the Shaheen Welfare Association Vs Union of India & Others case (1996) and Jayant Kumar Ghosh Vs NIA case (2014).

The Supreme Court, in its ruling on the PIL filed by Shaheen Welfare Association seeking relief to undertrial pri-

soners charged under the now-repealed TADA, had divided TADA detainees in four categories. While Category A comprised hardcore terror under-trials whose release would prejudice prosecution and whose liberty may be menace to the society, the other 3 categories had prisoners who were involved in terror cases but were not a threat to prosecution or society.

The SC ruled that while Category A cannot receive liberal treatment, Category B under-trials who have been in prison for five years or more and their trial unlikely to end in six months, could be released. For category C and D, it said they could be released on bail after 2-3 years in jail.

# J'khand on alert after series of lynchings

**Jamshedpur/Ranchi:** After back-to-back incidents of lynching, the Jharkhand government on Friday ordered police to take strict action against perpetrators of such crime.

On Thursday, villagers beat to death seven persons in East Singhbhum and Seraikela Kharsawan districts, accusing them of being child-lifters. On May 10, five people were lynched and as many injured in similar incidents in East Singhbhum district.

Chief minister Raghubar Das said: "I want strict punitive action against those involved in spreading rumours... Please report to the administration whenever you come across people spreading rumours." He announced compensation of Rs 2 lakh each to the families of those killed on suspicion of being child thieves.

Police said Gautam Kumar and Vikas Kumar Verma (two brothers from Jugsalai) and Ganesh Kumar Gupta (from Bagbera) were beaten to death by villagers at Nagadih in East Singhbhum on Thursday. "The three were killed when the villagers suspected them to be child thieves," they added.

On Thursday, some villagers also attacked four persons going to Seraikela in a car at a place under Rajnagar police station in Seraikela Kharsawan district. Police identified the dead as Sheikh Naem (from Haldipokhar) Mohammad Halim and Mohammad Sajjad (both from Ghatshila) and Mohammad Sheikh. "There are rumours about the four being cattle traders. We are trying to verify that," said SP (Seraikela Kharsawan) Rakesh Bansal.

# NIA takes note of TV sting op

Naming all of them in its preliminary enquiry (PE), NIA alleged Hurriyat leaders received funds to organise stone-pelting, arson attacks on schools and government buildings, destruction of property and attacks on forces.

The government sees stone-pelting and attacks on security forces as part of Pakistan's design to militarise "civil resistance" in the restive state by radicalising the youth. Sources said the separatist leaders, who have been defying the government's call to maintain peace in the Valley, could be in trouble if the charges against them are proved because, under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA), organising

funds for violence could qualify as "terror funding".

Sources said they would check bank accounts of the suspects, use of dummy companies for transfers from Pakistan or via a third country and hawala operators to ascertain the amount received from Hafiz Saeed and Pakistani agencies. Officials said they would turn the PE into a regular case once they found strong evidence of funding from Pakistan.

The NIA has also taken cognisance of a TV sting operation where some separatists are seen talking about getting funds from across the border. Some can be heard bragging how funds are routed by hawala operators via Dubai and other places.

Pakistan's foreign affairs adviser Sartaj Aziz said Islamabad, with a new team of lawyers, will put forward its case vigorously in ICJ against letting off of Jadhav on India's plea.

"Pakistan was set to re-challenge the jurisdiction of the ICJ after it granted injunction on Thursday on an Indian plea to stay Jadhav's execution," 'Dunya News' reported.
