Rupee dives to 3-week low of 64.59 against dollar

Caught in a downward spiral for the third straight session, the rupee on Thursday depreciated by 7 paise to end at a fresh three-week low of 64.59 on steady dollar demand amid deepening global oil rout. This is the lowest closing for the home currency since May 30, when it had closed at 64.66. Forex market traded with a broadly hesitant tone on growing uncertainty about global economic growth as sell-off in crude prices remained unabated, triggering volatility in financial markets. Demand for the greenback from banks and importers and little support from local share market too weighed on trade. PTI

Higher education shows disconnect with changing needs

India's higher education system is unable to respond to society's changing needs as only 40 per cent executives believe that new employees recruited in local labour markets have requisite skills, says an IBM Institute for Business Value study. According to the study in cooperation with Economist Intelligence Unit, addressing the looming talent shortage will be instrumental in preparing India for the competitive global economy. PTI

ADB president on 3-day India visit from June 27

Asian Development Bank (ADB) President Takehiko Nakao will be on a three-day India visit from June 27-29 during which he is scheduled to meet Finance Minister Arun Jaitley. Nakao will also meet Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and discuss the support of the Manila-headquartered multi-lateral funding agency to state government's development works. PTI

Maharashtra clamps down on banned drugs

The Maharashtra government has launched an enforcement exercise to crack down on the use of performance enhancing drugs and other banned substances in health supplements, food regulator Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) said on Thursday. FSSAI CEO Pawan Kumar Agarwal said the regulator has already provided the states a list of drugs banned by the World Anti-Doping Agency. PTI

'Bird-hit' GoAir plane with 155 onboard continues flight

One hundred and fifty five passengers onboard a Mumbai-bound GoAir plane from Delhi said the scare of their lives when the pilot allegedly continued to fly despite a bird hit instead of returning to the airport. Regulatory body Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has de-rostered the two pilots and initiated an inquiry, an official said. "We are treating the incident as a serious matter," said the DGCA official. PTI

New Delhi, 22 June

Rashtra Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) affiliated Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS) on Thursday said the 'wrong' policies of the NITI Aayog are creating jobless India and demanded reorganisation of the government's top policy making body.

"Wrong policies of the NITI Aayog are creating a jobless India," said Saji Narayanan, National president of the BMS in a statement. The statement quoted him as speaking at a meeting organised by the Delhi state BMS against the wrong policy of the NITI Aayog and demanded of 'equal pay for equal work' for contract labourers.



Narayanan demanded that the NITI Aayog should be reorganised with inclusion of those who think about India's real concerns, failing which the BMS would be compelled to go for further agitation.

According to the statement, employment crisis is already India's major economic issue and the country's two major employment generating sectors — agriculture and small scale sector — are in crisis.

Agricultural land is being converted into industrial land and industrial land into service land, due to 'perverted' policy. So far, the NITI Aayog has not given serious thought to it, it said.

In BMS' view, the policies are harming the sectors. The government's efforts to generate jobs do not tally with the loss of employment taking
