TRAIINEE CONSTABLES 'REVOLT'

Bihar Govt suspends 23 cops, 167 new recruits

The action was taken on the report of the Patna Inspector General of Police Nayanar Hasanain Khan

Taking a stern view of a "revolt" like situation and violence by the trainee constables and new recruits, the Government has dismissed 175 cops from the service, including 167 new recruits, 23 police constables suspended and many more transferred.

The action was taken on the report of the Patna Inspector General of Police Nayanar Hasanain Khan who conducted a detailed probe in the Friday

incident when the cops went on a rampage, assaulted senior official and trampled police line and its quarters. They were protesting over the death of a trainee constable Savita Pathak due to dengue.

Khan said the involvement of the dismissed and suspended constables was found in the violence. He said 23 police constables had been suspended for dereliction of duty. He also ordered for transfer of 93 personnel from Patna zone who were posted in Patna for over ten years. A constable DSP Maslehuddin Ahmad, who was assaulted and his quart barged in the attack, and one inspector rank official has also been recommended. Ahmad is posted in police line for a year.

The agitating cops had alleged that Savita was sick and was not granted leave. However, the inquiry revealed that she had been granted leave in September and October for three days each. But recently she had not applied for leave. However, four traffic police personnel have been suspended who were responsible for granting leave to new recruits. They have been charged for not informing about the illness of Savita to the senior officials.

This was the first time that such a revolt and violence by men and women in khaki happened in Bihar. Also this is the first time that dismissal and suspension of police personnel on such a large scale has been ordered.

Biometrics of Rohingyas will be collected in 2 months: J&K Govt

J&K Governor Satya Pal Malik on Monday said the task of collecting biometrics of Rohingyas (illegal immigrants from Myanmar) will be completed within two months. Biometric details of Rohingyas will be collected within two months. Work is already on. Malik said while addressing the media on the occasion of reopening of his annual Darbar Musoi' offices here in the winter capital of the State.

Union Home Minister Ram Nath Kohli had accorded priority to the sensitive issue of identifying the total number of illegal immigrants settled across different states in India.

In the recent months he flagged the issue on different occasions and also sent repeated reminders to the different State Governments to collect biometrics of Rohingyas to initiate the process of their relocation to their home country.

In January 2018 a report of the State Home department



Malik claimed that an estimated population of over 6500 Rohingyas are camping across 39 locations spread across five districts of the State.

According to official sources, a total number of 3194 males and 2916 females are staying in the State with valid UNHCR cards while 413 Rohingyas are staying without these Refugee cards.

Most of these Rohingyas staying in Jammu are camping closer to vital security installations and have occupied large chunks of land in Bathindi,

Narwal, Channi Himmat, Talab Tillo, Bari Brahmana, Isarabad, Sidhra, Panama Chowk and Malik Market area on Jyotswa road.

With every passing day their numbers are multiplying despite strict security restrictions at the Indo-Bangladesh border, possible route of infiltration inside the Indian territory of Myanmar.

On ground zero various political and other socio-polit

It is difficult to isolate them and identify them, claimed a political activist and regular lawyer working alongside various socio-political organisations in Jammu.

On the occasion Malik also expressed condolences on the death of Jammu & Kashmir Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) secretary Anant Parihar and his brother, Atet in Kashmir and said the terrorists who killed the brother have not been identified.

Terrorists were frustrated as the local body polls were conducted smoothly, hence, they carried out this murder.

The moral of the security forces is high, and no terrorists can disturb the 'samabayat' elections, he said.

It has been proved that it was an incident of militancy, he said, adding that it was an act of frustration on the part of militants and Pakistan.

"Those people (leaders of BJP senior leader and his brother) have been identified. Soon, results will be before you (media). Malik told reporters.

Khandu asks youths to research on less known historical facts

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Monday underscored the importance of documenting less-known historical facts of the State and said the Government would support research on this.

Many unknown and unwritten historical facts are being lost due to modernisation, Khandu said and called upon the youths to take up research works and document such historical facts which have been orally passed down through generations.

Addressing a book release programme in the Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) near here, the Chief Minister said the State Government is ready to fund such endeavours through the agencies and research wing of the university.

He released the book 'The Niyumi Massacre', written by Nephra Wangsa, a scholar of the RGU, for taking the pains

to go into oral history of the 1875 massacre that took place in a remote village in a long-distant inhabited by the Wancho tribe.

The Niyumi Massacre is about the resistance of the local people against an advancing British troops in 1875.

We have so many tribes residing in the state. I am sure there would be many unaccounted past events with historical significance, which are not known to the world due to lack of research and proper documentation, he said.

Khandu admitted that he never heard of the Niyumi Massacre till he got to know about the book release.

Wangsa, a native of Lunglees, said he had heard the story of the massacre during his childhood.

He said his research that spanned over 15 years took him to places like Sivasagar and Kolkata in search of documented proofs.

Ayodhya all set for mega 'Deepotsava'

First Lady of South Korea Kim Jung-sook was given a warm welcome on her arrival in the State capital Monday to attend the 'Deepotsava' when over 3 lakh diyas (earthen lamps) will be lighted at the ghats of Ayodhya on Tuesday.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has invited his colleagues welcomed her at the Chaudhary Charan Singh International Airport. Tourism Minister Rita Bahuguna Joshi accompanied the first lady from New Delhi in a special Korean flight.

Kim Jung-sook's presence assumes importance because of the link Korea has with Ayodhya. It is believed that a prince named King Ram of Ayodhya is believed to have born, became the queen in South Korea some 2,000 years ago. She also ruled a dynasty known as Karaik.

The CM will also honour the Ramlika artistes of different countries and in the night, Ramlika of different countries will be performed along with a cultural dance by the Korean team.

In the evening, over 3 lakh diyas will be lighted at Ram Ki Paudhi by over 5,000 volunteers. The Chief Minister will light the first special diya having a diameter of 16 feet.

Rita Bahuguna Joshi said that it would be a never before experience in Ayodhya. The city is all decked up with permanent façade lighting.
