

PROBE UNDERWAY, CONSTABLE SUSPENDED: POLICE

Red faces as police cleanliness award is given to private colony by mistake

DELHI POLICE Commissioner Anand Kumar Patil will next week distribute awards to the cleanest police colonies. The award ceremony is scheduled for May 25. The "honorarium" given to the awardee is for a person who is not a Delhi Police personnel.

The prize distribution ceremony was held at the police headquarters on May 16, and three colonies were selected under the 'big, medium' and

'small' categories for awards under the Swachh Bharat Mission cleanliness drive.

There are 165 police colonies in Delhi with around 15,000 flats. For the last three years, police have been conducting drives to check whether residents are keeping their colonies clean.

After each drive, the president of the resident welfare association (RWA) of these colonies is awarded a cash prize by the police chief for the colony's welfare.

Under the 'small' category, a

non-police colony from southwest Delhi's Vasant Kunj North was erroneously selected.

The RWA president of the non-police colony was invited to the police headquarters to receive the award.

Since police chief Anand Kumar Patil had to give away the award, all senior officers were called to attend the function.

The police chief gave the awards to all three RWAs and appreciated the effort. According to sources, at the last moment, the RWA president of the non-police

colony was not aware of the anomaly. After receiving the award when her bell number was asked, the RWA president said she is not from the Delhi Police.

The woman was then asked to return the award and was tendered a verbal apology for being wrongly felicitated, sources said, adding that the correct person was then given the award.

She was later given a certificate of appreciation for the cleanliness of her colony, said sources. A 'bell number' is a type of identification number

through which police personnel are identified.

When contacted, DCP (southwest) Milind Dhanbale said they have initiated a probe and suspended a constable in connection with the issue.

He said the confusion arose because the RWA presidents of the police and non-police colonies have the same names. "While comparing the list of RWAs, our constable posted in the administrative branch put the name of the private colony's RWA by mistake," said Dhanbale.

- The above Audited Financial Results were reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and thereupon approved and taken on record by the Board of Directors in their Meeting held on 22nd May, 2018. The statutory auditors have expressed unqualified and unmodified opinion.
- The Company has adopted Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) from 01st April, 2017 and accordingly financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles stated therein, prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and with the relevant rules issued thereunder. Financial results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2017 have been restated based on the Ind AS accounting. The figures of the last quarter are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published year to date figures for the quarter of the current financial year.
- Post the applicability of Goods and Services Tax (GST) with effect from July 1, 2017, Revenue from operations are required to be disclosed net of GST in accordance with the requirements of Ind AS. Accordingly the Revenue from operations for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2018 are not comparable with the Revenue from operations for quarter and year ended March 31, 2017 presented in the financial results which are reported inclusive of Excise Duty On a comparable basis. Revenue from operations (Net of Excise Duty) for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2018 grew by 16.53% and 6.07% respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- The Board of Directors have recommended final dividend of 175% i.e. Rs. 3.50 per equity share for the financial year 2017-18, subject to the approval of the shareholders in the annual General Shareholders Meeting. With this total dividend for the year (including interim dividend) of Rs. 7 per equity share paid during the year (i.e. Rs. 3.50 per equity share (A) 3.50%).

Cop made factually incorrect statement about me: CM to court

CHIEF MINISTER Arvind Kejriwal has filed an application in a city court seeking a copy of a statement recorded by police in connection with the alleged assault on Chief Secretary Anshu Prakash.

As per the application, the Investigation Officer (IO) of the case, Additional DCP Ilanender Singh, made a statement before the media about Kejriwal which was "factually incorrect". The court has directed the IO to appear in person on May 29.

On May 18, the CM was questioned by 50-member team for around three hours and was asked more than 100 questions.

After the questioning, Additional DCP Singh had told the media that the CM did not give "satisfactory answers", and that Deputy CM Manish Sisodia may also be questioned if the need arises.

Kejriwal, in the plea, said, "After the proceedings on that

day, the IO made a statement to the media in which he evaded or avoided certain questions by not giving specific and proper answers, which is factually incorrect... The conduct of the IO and DCP before the media gives an impression that police can go to any extent to frame the applicant or any other member of AAP by tampering with the said statement."

Saying that police had videographed the proceedings while recording his statement, the plea sought a copy of the CD as he was a "witness" and not an "accused". The statement recorded under Section 161 CrPC was a public document and the same is not confidential, the application stated.

Woman beaten to death by son

A 65-YEAR-OLD woman was beaten to death by her son in northern Delhi's Najafgarh, police said. The woman, Sharda Devi, was in a hospital for several days by her elder son and admitted to a local hospital on May 18. She died four days later.

DCP (northwest) Anil Kumar Thakur said, "When the woman was taken to the hospital, she was dehydrated and for statement. Based on the statement of her younger son, we arrested the accused, Amit Gauran."

Gauran's younger brother Ajay claimed his mother had been assaulted on several occasions. The beating on May 18 was triggered after his mother refused to divide her property. "My brother was drunk that day. He claimed his wife had divorced him and wanted a share in the property," Ajay said.

When his mother refused to do the same, the accused started punching her on the face, his brother said. "I tried to intervene and he beat me too," he said.

Murder of Jamia couple solved: Their son did it, say police

DCP (southeast) Chaitanya Biswal said, "Rehman was a divorcee. In 2016, he met a woman from Kanpur on Facebook. A year later, he married a woman his parents chose for him but he kept visiting Kanpur to meet the other woman. He even promised to marry her... Until recently, Rehman used to work in a call centre but quit over drug addiction problems. He was unemployed and without money, he had discussions about the other woman and expressed his wish to marry her. His parents objected. He then hatched a plan, along with two of his associates Nadeem Khan and Gulzar, to kill his parents so he would get their property and belongings."

"Rehman promised the two Rs 2.5 lakh for the job. He called them home and the trio attacked the couple while they were sleeping. Rehman eventually smothered them using a bedsheet. Abused put up a struggle and hit Khan's finger before he was suffocated to death," added the DCP.
