

- We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of MT Educare Limited ('the Company') for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2018 ('the Statement'), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as modified by Circular No. CIR/CFD/FAC/62/2016 dated July 5, 2016.
- 2. The Statement, as it relates to the quarter ended March 31, 2018 and the corresponding quarter ended in the previous year as reported in these standalone financial results are the balancing figures between audited standalone figures in respect of the full financial year and the published standalone year to date figures up to the end of the third quarter of the financial year, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" ('Ind AS 34'). 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
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
- 1 The Standalone and Consolidated audited Financial Results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on May 29, 2018.
- The Company is primarily engaged in one business segment namely coaching services as determined by the chief operating decision maker in accordance with IND AS 108 "Operating Segments".
- The Scheme of Arrangement ('Scheme') between Lakshya Forum for Competitions Private Limited (LEPL), Lakshya Educare Private Limited (LEPL) and their respective Shareholders was filed with the High Court of Judicature at Bombay and the High Court of Punjab & Haryana at Chandigarh. The Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Bombay approved the Scheme on May 4, 2016 subject to approval of the Scheme by High Court of Judicature at Punjab & Haryana. The Scheme was subsequently approved vide Order dated August 17, 2017 passed by National Company Law Tribunal Court Chandigarh Bench, Chandigarh on account of transfer from High Court of Judicature at Punjab & Haryana, effective April 1, 2014 which is the 'Appointed Date' prescribed in the Scheme. The Scheme has, accordingly, been given effect to in these audited Consolidated Financial Results.
- Direct expenses mainly includes purchase of tablets / SD cards which are issued to students as a part of course material, rent for coaching centres and fees paid to visiting faculties.
- The Company has adopted Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with the relevant rules issued thereunder, from April 01,2017 and accordingly, these standalone and consolidated audited financial results (including figures for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2017) have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Ind AS 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- Zee Learn has entered into share purchase agreement dated February 14, 2018 with the Company and invested Rs. 200 crores by way of issue of 31,964,200 equity shares of the Company @ Rs. 62.57 per share on preferential basis. The said amount of Rs. 200 crores is held in Escrow account as on balance sheet date.


